
Nathan Box

Additionally, Lindsay is the co-Chair and Treasurer for Yehaw Indigenous Creatives Collective's Board of Directors as well as an Equitable Development Initiative and The Common Acre Board Member. She also serves on the King County Communities of Opportunity Governance Committee. Lindsay is a mother of 3, Auntie to many, and a member of the Alabama-Coushatta Tribe of Texas. She was born and raised in Pacific Northwest on the Lummi Reservation and spends her downtime with cracking jokes, singing with her family drum group Flickertail, harvesting and making traditional remedies, and feeding any and everyone who comes through her door.
