CCR's Child Care Subsidy Program for Families Experiencing Homelessness

- For families living in **Seattle***, **Bellevue**, **Redmond**, **Kent** or **Pierce County**
- Families must be experiencing homelessness according to [McKinney Vento](#):
- **OR** for families less than 6 months into permanent housing

City Of Seattle*:

- Families must occasionally reside within Incorporated Seattle City Limits.



CCR's Child Care Subsidy Program for Families Experiencing Homelessness (continued)

- Helps families who are eligible get connected to state subsidy, find child care providers, create payment plans, etc.
- Can assist families who are not currently eligible (or will never be eligible) for the state subsidy
- Low barrier enrollment
- Families can get referred by the Call Center, community partners, providers and more.

Suburban Cities Child Care Financial Assistance (CCFA):

- Helps families who become eligible get connected to state subsidy, find child care providers, connect to community partners, etc.
- Can assist families who are not currently eligible (or will never be eligible) for the state subsidy

Suburban CCFA Eligibility:

- Funding available for families living in Redmond, Bellevue, and Covington
- All adults in the household must be in training, school, or working
- Families must be ineligible for Working Connections Child Care (WCCC)
- Must fall under income limits

Veteran Student Child Care Subsidy

<u>Income Guidelines:</u>

King County Veteran Student Child Care Subsidy:

- Helps families find child care providers, connect to community partners, etc.
- Can assist families who are not currently eligible (or will never be eligible) for the state subsidy, as well as eligible families
- Can pay for licensed child care and Family, Friend, and Neighbor (FFN) care

Veteran Student Child Care Subsidy Eligibility:

- Family must live in King County
 - At least one parent must have served at least one day in the military, any discharge type
- AND**
- Must be a student or enrolled in a job training program
- Must fall under income limits

ABOUT THE SUBSIDY

Best Starts for Kids is a King County voter-approved initiative to support every baby born or raised in King County to reach adulthood happy, healthy, safe and thriving. Starting in 2022, these investments include a new child care subsidy program! Families who meet the eligibility requirements may qualify to receive help paying for their child care. King County is partnering with Scholar Fund to administer the program. Staff from several community-based organizations—Child Care Resources, A 4 Apple Learning Center, White Center Community Development Association, and Voices of Tomorrow—are available to help families apply for and/or use the subsidy.



In-language assistance, accommodations for disability, and other navigational supports are available.

Families may be eligible for the subsidy if they:

- live in King County
- have one or more children below age 12
- are using a licensed child care provider
- are not eligible to receive WA State's Working Connections Child Care (WCCC) subsidy
- fall within the income eligibility (see table)
